

Corfree, Lough Gowna

Directions

From Dublin take the N4 to Edgeworthstown. From there take right in the middle of town onto the N55 towards Cavan. At Granard take a left in the main street and then bear right into Colmcille Terrace. Follow this road to Lough Gowna village where the Piker's Inn is on your left at the crossroads. From the village take the road to Arva. After almost a mile, at the top of the hill you will see a farmyard entrance on your left. Cross the cattlegrid and continue down to the lake where there is a new road and resurfaced car park.

Summary

Bream, roach and a some hybrids are all present. Bream will respond to feeder methods but if the wind is blowing onto the shore they will come in closer onto long pole or waggler/slider lines. Match target species is focus for roach on the pole but with regular casts to a feeder line for bonus bream. Heavy feeding can often pay off here.
